Minutes

- I. Call to orderMr. Fritsch called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm.
- II. Public comment regarding items on the agenda
  Amanda Saklad spoke with regard to the CHCS Nature's Classroom field trip. She
  expressed her concerns about the coverage for special ed students on the trip. Last year
  her husband went and spent most of his time with their son. She questioned what the
  procedure is for students in an all-inclusive classroom. Ms. Saklad also requested that
  there be a policy for student support. The concerns were addressed during the Nature's
  Classroom field trip approval request on the agenda, item IX, B.
- III. Special awards and presentationsThere were no special awards or presentations.
- IV. Update from BHS Student Advisory Council representatives Ben Stone updated the School Committee.

**CSS:** students have begun their bi-weekly visits to the Clapp Memorial Library. Children's librarian, Jennifer Whitehead, reads a story to them after which they browse for books. **SRE;** students were assessed with the easyCBM math assessment system, using the computer labs and iPads.

**CHCS**; 6<sup>th</sup> grade students have started broadcasting daily morning announcements from the TV station in the library with the help of librarian, Mrs. Marley.

**JBMS**; the 5K road race will be held November 8<sup>th</sup>, to support the JBMS after school program.

**BHS**; Humanities Club is hosting the "Monster Mash" on Thursday, October 29<sup>th</sup> in the BHS cafeteria from 6:00 pm to 8:00 pm.

### VI. Reports and recommendations of the Superintendent

Superintendent Coffin noted the Vision team met at CHCS. There was a greater turn out that at previous schools. The next meeting is November 2<sup>nd</sup> at SRE. Superintendent Coffin noted that child care would be available. CSS will hold their meeting November 16<sup>th</sup> at 6:30. The meetings are open to everyone. Belchertown will host Rice University November 18<sup>th</sup> with a STEMposium. This is available for the area. Superintendent Coffin us opening the event to local area educators. November 3 will be a professional development day with a presentation by Ruth Poti who is a leading expert in opioid addiction. This presentation is open to all Belchertown employees. Superintendent Coffin is also inviting surrounding communities nursing staff. The presentation is at 1:30 November 3<sup>rd</sup>, in the BHS auditorium. Ms. Bogdanovich noted this is a subject that touches everyone.

#### VII. Personnel Update

Superintendent Coffin noted Mr. Fortin starting yesterday. He is also working on a professional development for January.

## VIII. Unfinished business

A. Discussion on committee members' reimbursement

Motion: Ms. Bogdanovich moved to send to the Personnel & Policy Committee

Second: Dr. Laughner

Vote: 5,0,0

Discussion: The Committee discussed the policy with regard to member reimbursement. It was noted that there is no policy and no historical data on previous members' reimbursement. Discussion involved benefits to the district for members attending conferences. Superintendent Coffin noted that employees of the district are reimbursed if participation is required, but if it is something an employee wants to attend and it is not required it is not reimbursed.

#### IX. New Business

A. BHS Out of State Field Trip Request (Heritage Music Festival, Florida) (A.I.)

Motion: Ms. French moved to approve the chorus field trip for April 28-May1st.

Second: Dr. Knapp

Vote: 4,0,1 (Mr. Fritsch abstained)

Discussion: Susan Comstock presented the request. Mr. Fritsch noted his son is attending and will abstain from the vote. Ms. Comstock noted the cost is currently set at \$1,100, she is still trying to reduce the cost. There are many fundraising events going on to help fund the cost. Dr. Laughner questioned if a more local trip would be considered? Ms. Comstock noted historically they take a trip every 2 years. The last trip was to Chicago, 4 years ago they went to Florida. They had previously planned to go to Florida every 4 years and will consider for future trips.

B. CHCS Overnight Field Trip Request (Nature's Classroom) (A.I.)

Motion: Ms. Bogdanovich moved to approve the Nature's Classroom field trip.

Second: Dr. Knapp

Vote: 5,0,0

Discussion: Ms. Fitzgerald, Ms. Bernashe, and Ms. Breen presented the request. The trip is scheduled for June 8-10 in Cape Cod. Ms. Bogdanovich requested they address Ms. Saklad concerns. Ms. Fitzgerald noted that parents of students currently in self-contained classrooms are offered first to chaperone. Discussion with regard to the amount of coverage for students on the trip. Mr. Cameron noted that every student has a one on one coverage. Ms. Fitzgerald noted that the school will meet with parents to discuss and plan for supervision. Mr. Cameron noted the need for careful wording for any policy dealing with a protected class. Ms. Bernashe suggested the possibility of adding a 3<sup>rd</sup> chaperone to each group. Ms. Bernashe also noted that she reviews all chaperone requests with the principal and SPED teachers before approving the chaperones. Dr. Laughner noted he has a student attending.

- C. Summary of MASC Divisions V, VIII and IX Joint Division Meeting Dr. Knapp attended and presented the School Committee with a summary. He noted there are 3 resolutions that may apply to Belchertown;
  - Resolution 1 regarding high school starting times
  - Resolution 2 Poverty & children advocate to ask for funding
  - Resolution 7 relative to the TS-Gold assessments for kindergarten students.

Superintendent Coffin noted the TS-Gold assessment is attached to the kindergarten grant. CSS has done this for 2 years and it is very time consuming and difficult to sustain. She also noted there is an educational gap in the low income group that is fairly consistent. Historical info notes the gap in CPI is less in Belchertown than in the state. The gap has closed in ELA and science but has widened in math. This gap is across levels.

Discussion: Dr. Laughner requested clarification on #6 of the policy. Superintendent Coffin noted the language was given by legal counsel for the addition of private awards.

3. Recommendation to Approve Policy EBCD, Lightning/Threatening Weather (A.I.) Motion: Ms. Bogdanovich moved to approve policy EBCD as amended.

Amended Motion: Ms. Bogdanovich moved to replace with policy EBCD-1

Second: Ms. French

Vote: 5,0,0

Discussion: Dr. Laughner noted all "contest" should be replaced with "event".

The Committee agreed to replace as noted.

Dr. Knapp questioned;

- does policy differs substantially from the original policy?
- does this supersede policy EBCD?
- this is consistent with MIAA guidelines, is it necessary?

Ms. Bogdanovich noted this would supplement the MIAA policy. Superintendent Coffin noted Mr. Hastings has developed safe zones for each location. Mr. Hastings noted that the golf courses each have a safe zone during inclement weather.

4. Recommendation to Approve Suspension Policy and Regulations (A.I.)

Motion: Ms. Bogdanovich moved to amend the policy.

Amended Motion: Ms. Bogdanovich moved to table.

Vote: 5,0,0

Discussion: Mr. Cameron requested this item be tabled. Legal counsel has noted

there are changes needed.

Mr. Fritsch noted nothing at this time.

Dr. Laughner noted the committee met earlier. There are a series of meetings scheduled to coincide with the central office budgeting schedule.
